5 KEY TAKEAWAYS: Ideas for Lesson Preparation

1. Engage in deep study: Take time to thoroughly understand your teaching topic before delivering it to others. Use resources like dictionaries or study guides for additional insights.

2. Ask questions of yourself, first. Then encourage an interactive session where you ask thought-provoking questions about the subject matter being taught.

3. Personalize lessons: Try applying the teachings first on a personal level before relaying them to others - this makes your lesson more authentic and relatable.

4. Connect teachings with Jesus Christ: Always connect your teachings back to Jesus Christ and His Doctrine & principles.

5. Foster self-reflection: Encourage students/listeners towards introspection based on the lessons learned - this aids better comprehension and application in real life situations.
